

## School Action Plan: Whitwell Primary School 2013-2014

### Area for improvement: PE Curriculum (C) , Competitive Sports (CS) and Healthy Lifestyles (HL)

**Current position:** All schools will receive a lump sum of £8,000 plus £5 per pupil as of census for the next two years to promote PE and sport and create a lasting legacy to improve outcomes for children. A recent staff audit backs the Government’s notion that the quality of PE lessons needs to be enhanced through further CPD. For competitive sports we already offer a variety of out of school clubs to cater for different interests and we enter some competitions organised by the cluster. We have a leading teacher for this area (Miss Amy Bingham-TLR). One child currently in the academy for Gifted and Talented run by the Bolsover District School Sports Partnership- signposted through school. A Lunch time Play leader has been employed since September 2012, to support the mini-leader programme and Change for Life Club and encourage active lunchtimes and promote a healthy lifestyle.

## School Action Plan: Whitwell Primary School 2014-2015

### Area for improvement: PE Curriculum (C) , Competitive Sports (CS) and Healthy Lifestyles (HL)

**Current position:** All schools will receive a lump sum of £8,000 plus £5 per pupil as of census, to promote PE and sport and create a lasting legacy to improve outcomes for children. For the academic year 2013-14 Whitwell Primary School entered the full SSP competition and festival programme for all key stages, winning 4 events and representing the cluster at the district for: Netball, Y5/6 girls cross country, quad kids athletics and Kwick cricket. The cricket team won the District Finals and were invited to represent the district at the County Finals. This shows increased participation and achievement from the previous year. For competitive sports we offer after school clubs for: netball, indoor bowls, dance and cross country and we sign post children to Whitwell Cricket Club and Whitwell FC. Using the Sports Premium money last year we also had a gymnastics club for 6 weeks. Three children are currently in the academy for Gifted and Talented run by the Bolsover District School Sports Partnership- signposted through school. We currently have a pupil signed for Chesterfield FC and for the last academic year, one child was selected for North East Derbyshire Cricket Team; another for the Derbyshire County Cricket Team and another child was scouted to join Doncaster Rovers FC and played in the national Pilgrim Cup. Gifted and Talented children are excelling. Sports Premium School Action Plan is published on school website and 'School Club' page advertises and promotes sporting events and celebrates sporting success. Ks1/FS using fundamental movement skill curriculum to develop physical literacy. Physical Literacy intervention programme run by Gemma Basford (after training).

Staffing changes see our leading teacher for this area (Mrs Amy Plaister-TLR) on maternity leave for the majority of this year. Our Lunch time Play leader has moved onto a new job, so the mini-leader programme, Change for Life Club and active lunchtimes will need reassessing. A new Head teacher: Lisa Duncan starts in September 2014 and a new Deputy Head teacher is due to start in January 2015.

**School Action Plan: Whitwell Primary School SUMMER TERM 2 2015**

**Area for improvement: PE Curriculum (C) , Competitive Sports (CS) and Healthy Lifestyles (HL)**

**Current position:**

AMY PLAISTER RETURNED FROM MATERNITY LEAVE ON 1<sup>ST</sup> JUNE 2015-REVIEWED PLAN AND PRIORITISED FOR FINAL TERM.

Mrs Plaister now works 3 days a week and no-longer has a TLR in this area but still remains the P.E. Coordinator.

In Mrs Plaister absence, a temporary teacher took responsibility for P.E. He left at Christmas, leaving the Headteacher (who was newly appointed in September 2014) and the new SLT to organise and budget the sports premium.

A Bronze Kitemark has been awarded; Whitehall residential for year 4/5 children has been organised; equipment has been bought and Whitwell Primary have entered the full SSP competition and festival programme for all key stages, winning the cluster Kwik Cricket and representing at the district. We have had cricket coaching in curriculum time for the year 5 class, in preparation for the Kwik Cricket cluster tournament. A new tennis club has been introduced for all age groups after school and within curriculum time for the lead up to Wimbledon.

Unfortunately, no children are in the academy for Gifted and Talented run by the Bolsover District School Sports Partnership. The School's Website has been 'revamped' so the existing 'School Club' page which advertised and promoted sporting events and celebrated sporting success needs reinventing. We currently have no 'play leader' thus no Change for Life Club; Mini Leader programme or active lunch time programme is in place.

**SUMMER 2 YEAR 2 Key tasks:**

- Appoint 2 x new Lunch time Play Leaders (1 for KS1 and 1 for KS2)- reinstall Golden Mile and active lunchtimes. (Change for Life Club and Mini-Leader Programme to start in Sept with new cohort)
- To purchase outdoor storage for both playgrounds for constant provision to encourage active lunchtimes.
- To purchase/ provide constant provision for active lunchtimes.
- To embed the new scheme of work in KS2.
- Identify G&T and update register (ask teachers to do assessments similar to the Bolsover District School Sports

**We will know we have succeed when:**

- New Lunch time programme is back up and running including Golden mile initiative
- 2 outdoor playground storage units have been purchased and are full with constant provision for playtimes (separate to the P.E. cupboard)
- Clear guidance on what to teach and how to teach it well with teachers familiar with the new scheme.
- Have an updated G&T register.
- Offer a wide variety of sports within and outside the curriculum
- Coaching is in place for Autumn Term (at least Football and Basketball)
- New equipment has been audited and budget is up-to-date
- Gymnastic equipment has been safety checked.
